## PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

I gained initial experience in conservation work volunteering at OSIENALA (Friends of Lake Victoria), Uvumbuzi Club and Wildlife Clubs of Kenya while pursuing my degree in Environmental Studies at Kenyatta University.

Since January 2002, I have focused on marine and coastal awareness initially working at Wildlife Clubs of Kenya coordinating education and awareness activities in Coast Province working closely with member schools and other organizations. Later while at Baobab Trust, I worked with fisher folk promoting awareness on turtles and ensuring records of sightings, stranding, releases and nesting were maintained and forwarded to KESCOM. During that time, I also led training of self-help groups to promote sustainable practices such as organic farming, fish and poultry farming, biogas production and compost making. In addition, I got involved in a program training teachers in environmental education.

From 2005, I have been leading the teachers' training program in environmental education through the Environmental Education Initiative (EEI) while based at CORDIO East Africa. In addition, I am involved in a marine awareness program for schools dubbed 'Schools to the Sea' and working with women groups to promote adult education, information technology and alternative livelihoods in order to reduce reliance on fisheries.

- Coordination and implementation of regional teachers training program in environmental education that has seen over 90% of the teachers certified after implementing projects in their schools. 66 teachers have been trained

- Implementation of adult education component in a project utilizing education and information communication technologies to enhance sustainable livelihood activities where eight women groups have learnt basic literacy skills and how to use computers and internet
